JAMES MULLINGER

Comedian James Mullinger loves to say “yes.” To the gigs, the speeches, the family commitments, anything that comes his way, he says “absolutely, yes.” It’s his greatest strength, and his greatest weakness. After reading his memoir *Brit Happens*, friends suggested that his misadventures in scheduling could be more than just folly, foolishness, or fun-gone-wrong.

It turns out, they were right. After seeking professional help, James was the only one surprised to learn that he has ADHD. His late-stage diagnosis helped him come to terms with his past foibles—like the time he fell in love with Kate Winslet by correspondence or the disastrous course of events that led him to bomb on stage in what should have been a triumphant return to his hometown. It also helped him understand that his ADHD—the hyper-focus, the multitasking, the retelling of old embarrassments—held the key to his success.

Attention, Please! is a heart-warming, hilarious, and sometimes instructive account of one comedian’s journey to self-acceptance and (at times) a calmer life in a world that wasn’t designed for a million-miles-an-hour brain.

JAMES MULLINGER is an award-winning, British-born Canadian comedian, writer, and broadcaster. A former comedy editor of *GQ* magazine, he has become one of Canada’s most in-demand touring comedians, appearing more than a dozen times on CBC’s *The Debaters*, headlining at theatres across Canada, and starring in stand-up specials and feature films.

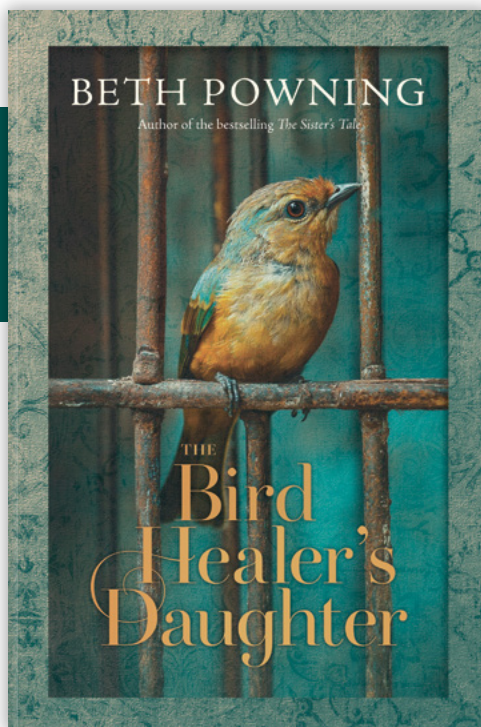

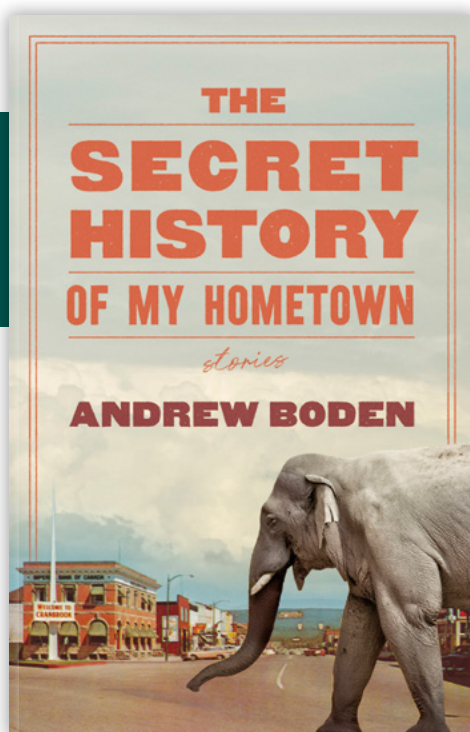

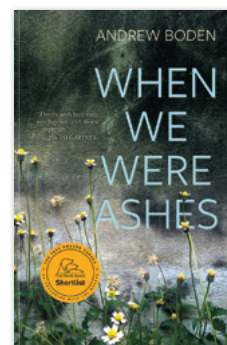

The Secret History of My Hometown

ANDREW BODEN

- Boden's stories contain a counterfactual/magical realist element as characters like Ernest Hemingway and Leon Trotsky appear in Cranbrook's imagined history.
- The 1926 elephant hunt in "Hemingway and the Elephants" was a real historical event caused by elephants escaping from a travelling circus.

Cranbrook, British Columbia, is your quintessential Rocky Mountain town, but in *The Secret History of My Hometown*, it is anything but typical. A young lovesick Ernest Hemingway hunts for missing elephants; Leon Trotsky decides that Cranbrook, not Mexico City, is the perfect place to hide away; and after the bombing of Pearl Harbor, a Chinese family's grocery store's survival rests in the hands of the legendary Monkey King.

Andrew Boden provides an array of original voices that add humour and personality to this imagined history, resulting in a collection of stories that demonstrate the powerfully deep and often unremembered history of small-town life.

ANDREW BODEN is the author of *When We Were Ashes*, a finalist for the Amazon Canada First Novel Award. Originally from Cranbrook, he now lives in Burnaby in the Lower Mainland of British Columbia.

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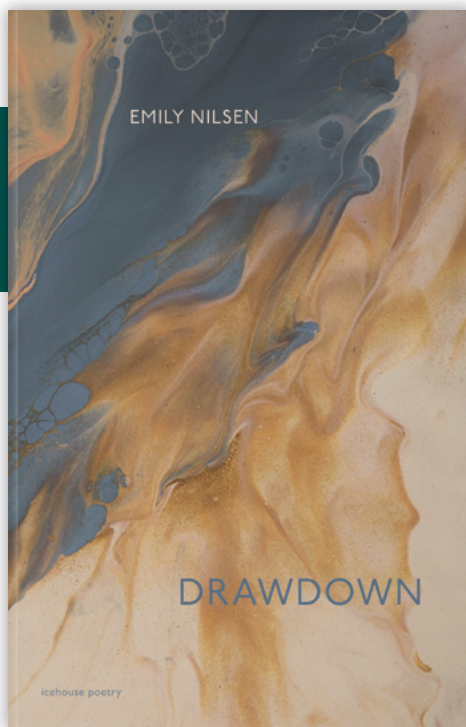

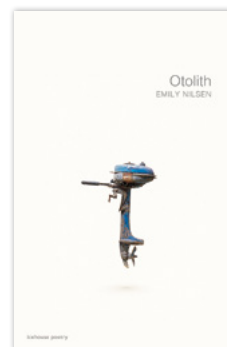

EMILY NILSEN

Finalist, Pamela Paige Porter Poetry Prize

In reservoirs, the drawdown zone is the land between high and low water where, due to fluctuating levels, a diversity of flora and fauna fail to thrive. Emily Nilsen's *Drawdown* finds words for the grief of recurrent miscarriages in the shadow of a reservoir, where a once-lush valley no longer pulses with life.

Raw, vulnerable, and unflinchingly honest, *Drawdown* explores the overlap between ecology and physiology, looking for beauty in dysfunction and ways to coexist with industrial and unborn hauntings. These poems speak and listen in tandem as they navigate the waters of complicated loss.

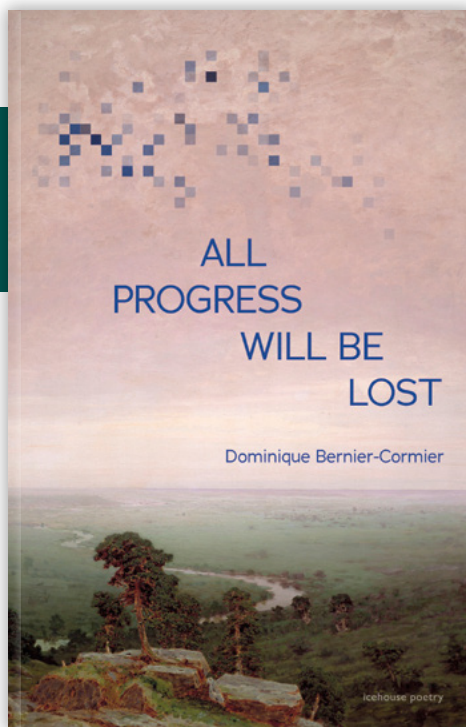

All Progress Will Be Lost

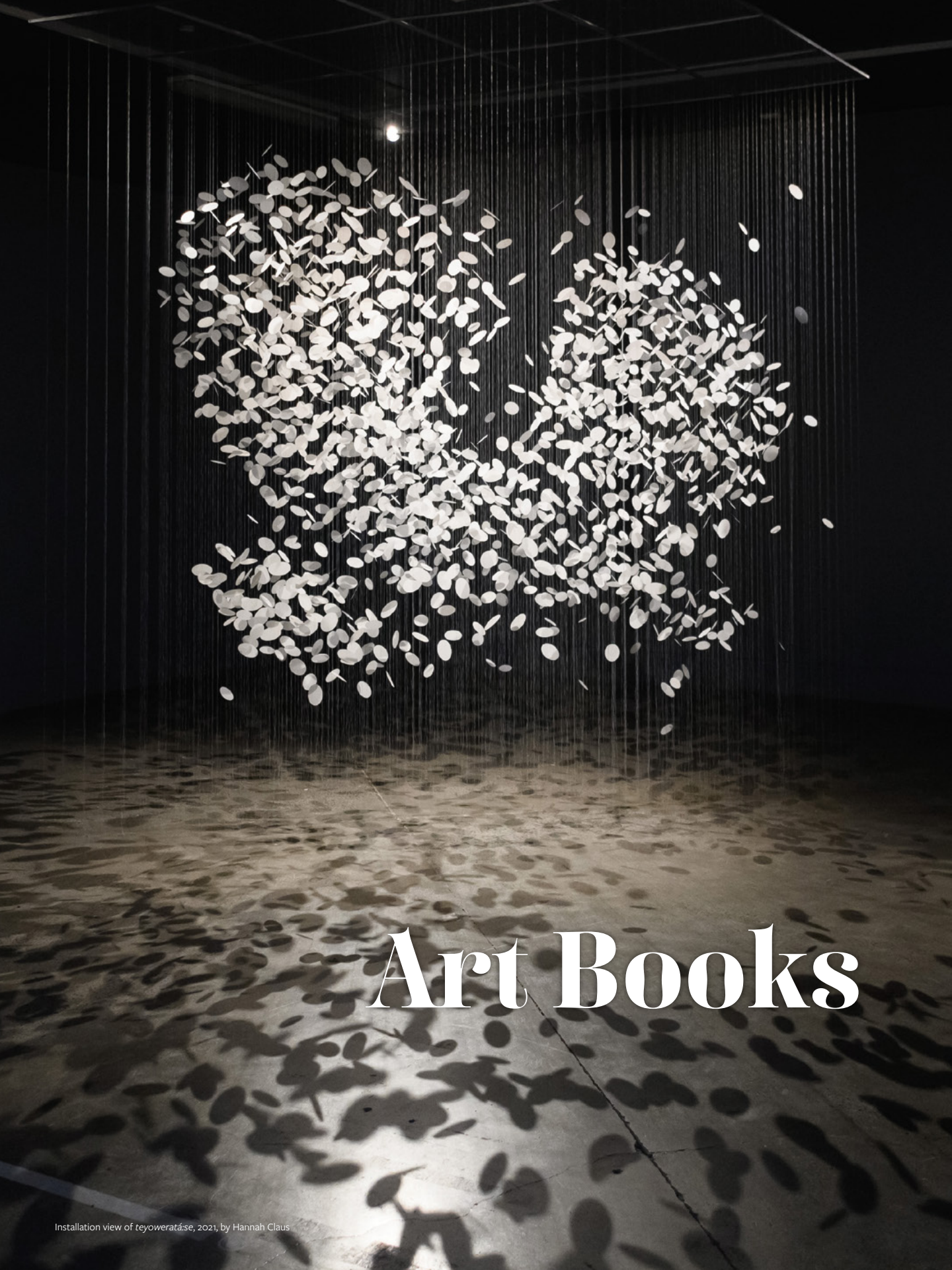
DOMINIQUE BERNIER-CORMIER

Reflective in every sense of the word, Dominique Bernier-Cormier’s *All Progress Will Be Lost* is both mirror and memory, bringing together nature and technology to produce surreal flashes of the world around us. Bernier-Cormier wields language like a sculptor uses a chisel, making the unyielding malleable, capturing fleeting moments frozen in time. “Metaphors,” he writes, “begin in the world, not in your head.”

The poems of this breathtaking collection blur the line between the interior and the exterior, calling artificiality and syntheticism into question, delving into the distance between source and echo. *All Progress Will Be Lost* approaches the climate emergency with both fear and hope, articulating the small, everyday apocalypses and the transient beauty of endings: fighting erosion with roses or free soloing what remains of a glacier.

DOMINIQUE BERNIER-CORMIER is a Québécois/Acadian poet and translator. His poems have won *The Fiddlehead*’s Ralph Gustafson Contest, *The Malahat Review*’s Open Season Award, and *Arc*’s Poem of the Year. His most recent book, *Entre Rive and Shore*, was a finalist for the Dorothy Livesay Prize and won the Fred Cogswell Award. He lives in Vancouver, where he writes and teaches Grade 9 English.

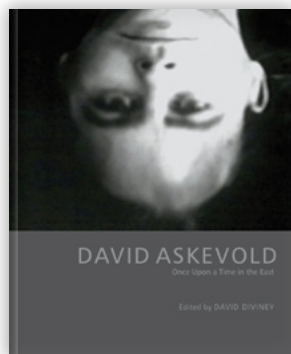

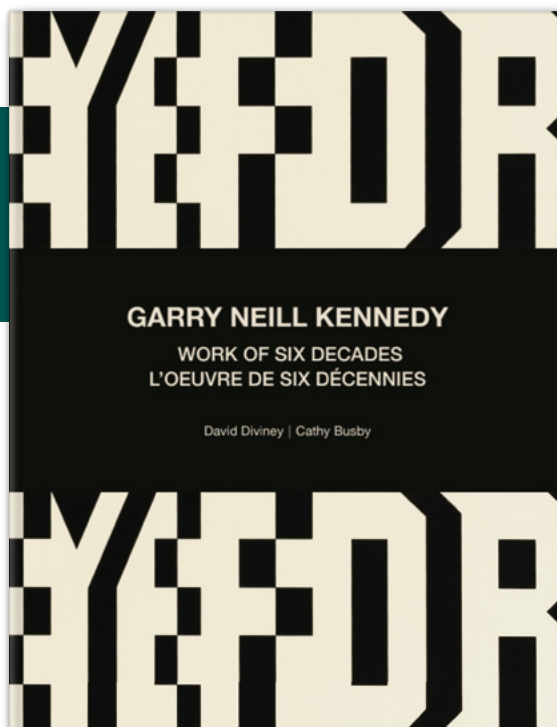

Work of Six Decades | L'œuvre de six décennies

Edited by DAVID DIVINEY and CATHY BUSBY

Over a six-decade career as a conceptual artist, educator, and administrator, Garry Neill Kennedy became one of the leading figures in Canadian art. His early work interrogated systems of colour, instruction, and labour as they related to the production of art and the physical and institutional space in which it operates, before turning outward to become more explicitly political in the 21st century.

In addition to his work as a conceptual artist, Kennedy is known for his work as a professor and president of NSCAD. During his 23-year tenure as president, he established the school as an internationally renowned art institution, connecting Halifax with larger artistic centres, including New York's contemporary art scene.

Garry Neill Kennedy: Work of Six Decades | L'œuvre de six décennies features hundreds of images of the artist's work from all stages of his career, as well as essays by artists and curators. Accompanying a major exhibition opening at the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia in February 2027 and touring nationally thereafter, the volume demonstrates the enduring relevance of Kennedy's work in an age where confronting structures and critiquing systems of power has never been more important.

DAVID DIVINEY is the Chief Curator at the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia. CATHY BUSBY is a conceptual artist from Vancouver. She was Garry Neill Kennedy's partner from 2001 until his death in 2021.

Kanien’kehá:ka artist Hannah Claus’s works consider the continuity of Indigenous knowledge systems and the ways these are embedded in land, water, and Sky World. Her practice foregrounds the inseparability of Indigenous languages and worldviews from place and invites viewers to consider *Indigenous* histories and cosmologies as situated within contemporary artforms, expressing and platforming Kanien’kehá:ka ways of knowing and understanding.

Hannah Claus: ietsikeraniiontha [she hangs the clouds | celle qui déploie les nuages] brings together installation, photography, moving image, and textile works produced by the artist between 2003 and 2026 to accompany the most ambitious exhibition of her work, at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts and the Beaverbrook Art Gallery with a subsequent national tour. Over 30 images of Claus’s work accompany essays by the artist, curators Léuli Eshrāghi and Emma Hassencahl-Perley, and scholars Jolene Rickard and Peter Morin.

LÉULI ESHRĀGHI (Tagata Sāmoa) is an artist, writer, and the Curator of Indigenous Practices at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts. EMMA HASSENCAHL-PERLEY is a Wolastoqey (Wolastoqewiyik) visual artist, curator, and arts writer from Neqotkuk (Tobique First Nation), New Brunswick. She is the Curator of Indigenous Art at the Beaverbrook Art Gallery in Fredericton.

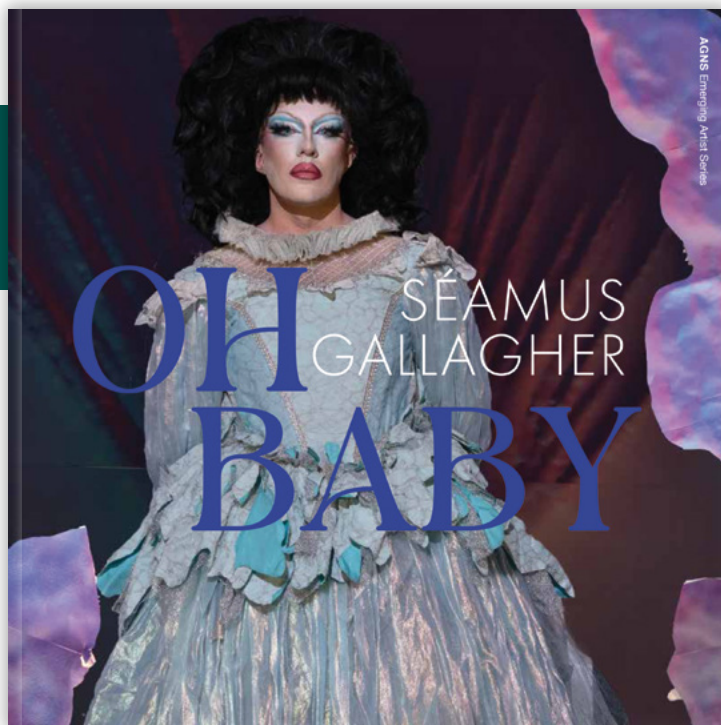

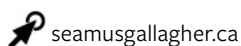

- *OH BABY*, Gallagher's first hometown show, appeared at the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia from February to May 2025. It will tour to the Beaverbrook Art Gallery, Université de Moncton, and Cape Breton University Art Gallery in 2027.
- Gallagher's art combines photography, video, sculpture, drag, and speculative fiction.
- Gallagher is a past finalist for the Sobey Art Award.

Séamus Gallagher: OH BABY combines photography, video, drag, speculative fiction, sculpture, and costuming to interrogate ideas of gender and the environment, using a forest fire that broke out in Arizona in 2017 following a gender reveal explosion as a spark of inspiration.

Considering this trend of gender reveal parties turning into natural disasters, *Séamus Gallagher: OH BABY* imagines what it might mean to be assigned a forest fire at birth amid a collapsing climate. Using a range of image-making techniques, Gallagher examines the ways in which human-made technologies and ideas frame our worldviews and fail us as a result. They work from the belief that various histories, narratives, and ideas can (and must) coexist: the camp and the critical, the past and the future, the natural and the other.

DAVID DIVINEY is the Chief Curator at the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia.

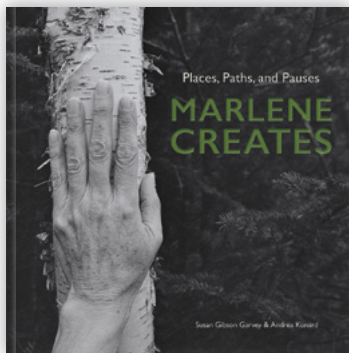

In this exploration of studio photography, Andrea Kunard and her collaborators Julie Crooks, Deepali Dewan, Alyssa Fearon, Sherry Farrell Racette, Michael Jonathan Square, and Karen Tam investigate how the photographer's studio has been a dynamic place of creative expression that has both created and reframed identities.

Drawing on the National Gallery of Canada's collection, alongside works from other institutions and community archives, *Sites of Agency | Postures* explores the photographic studio as more than a site of image-making, but as a space of exchange and creative negotiation. From early daguerreotypes and 19th-century studio practices to contemporary approaches, this volume shows how artists, sitters, and photographers have used the camera to express identity, heritage, and voice across diverse cultural contexts.

More than any other medium, photography offers the possibility of being seen, remembered, and affirmed. Combined, these images reveal the studio as a powerful site of agency, where those before the lens can declare themselves positively to the world.

Modern Art, Modern Life The Rapp Collection

Edited by ALEXA GREIST and JIM SHEDDEN,
with MATTHEW TEITELBAUM

Modern Art, Modern Life: The Rapp Collection celebrates the extraordinary collection of modern and contemporary art that Carol and Morton Rapp acquired over seven decades. Now resident in the AGO's Prints and Drawings collection, the Rapp collection features over 450 works by more than 200 artists, including Lee Bontecou, David Hockney, Jasper Johns, William Kentridge, Kent Monkman, and Andy Warhol. Unique among Toronto collectors, the Rapps were especially drawn to printmakers and photographers who pushed the medium forward. Their collection chronicles the renaissance in these mediums during the 1960s and 1970s and their continued evolution into the 21st century.

Modern Art, Modern Life features reproductions of a selection of 150 works and archival documents from the full collection, as well as essays by curators and artists including Christophe Cherix, Jim Dine, Rachel Anne Farquharson, Alexa Greist, Tom McDonough, David Moos, Kitty Scott, Sasha Suda, Maia-Mari Sutnik, and Matthew Teitelbaum. Together they present a fresh look at previously unknown works by major artists and examine the role that collecting plays in shaping institutions and art history.

ALEXA GREIST is Curator & R. Fraser Elliott Chair, Prints and Drawings, at the Art Gallery of Ontario (AGO). JIM SHEDDEN is Curator, Special Projects, and Director, Publishing, at the AGO. MATTHEW TEITELBAUM is the former director of the Art Gallery of Ontario and the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston.

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
